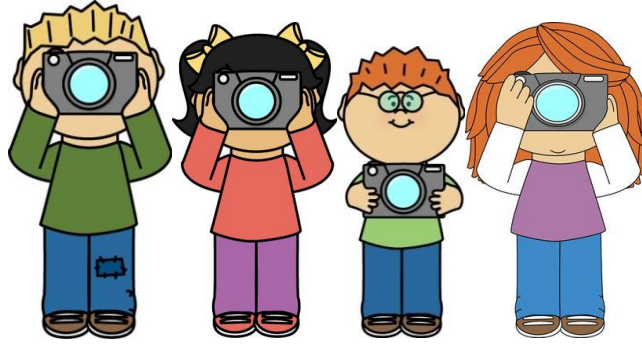


PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB



Learn how to take amazing pictures with Mrs. Galligan!

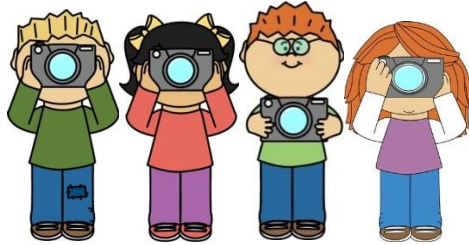
This year our club is open to 4th – 8th graders.

- Learn how digital cameras work.

- Take lots of practice photos.
- Share and talk about photos.
- Use editing software to improve your photos or get creative!

We will meet on Thursdays after school from 3:00-4:00 P.M. from September 14th – November 2nd. Students may borrow a point-and-shoot camera from the school. If a student is familiar with his/her own digital point-and-shoot or a DSLR he/she may use that camera instead. Any other accessories that students want to experiment with (tripods...) are welcome.

The cost of this club is \$60 per student. This includes the student's choice of several print options. Students will edit and submit at least one picture that I will print and mount for display as a culminating activity. These will be exhibited during Catholic Schools Week in January. Students may also share their photos in the Stevenson High School Consortium Art Festival in May.
